California Supreme Court Decision on Labor Shakes Up Uber, Lyft



A GROUNDBREAKING CALIFORNIA SUPREME COURT DECISION states that "gig workers" are only independent contractors under strict conditions which Uber, Lyft, and other "ride-sharing" (for money) services do not meet. But count on \$51 billion to turn cranks for the companies.

The California Supreme Court ruled recently that workers can be independent contractors only if their tasks are outside the scope of the hiring company's business, if the company does not control how they work, and if they run independent business-

es doing that work, sending Uber, Lyft, and similar companies back to their drawing boards and board rooms.

Khosrowshahi, noting that he had successfully suckered a lot of Uber drivers into signing into agreeing to binding arbitration, which protected him from a class-action lawsuit. Uber's exotic take on labor has resulted in its being banned or restricted in Alaska, Oregon (except Portland) in the United States, Vancouver in Canada, Bulgaria, Denmark, Greece, Hungary, Italy, Germany, London, the Northern Territory in Australia, Japan, and Taiwan, but CEO Khosrowshahi dismisses the criticism, noting that people are just too dumb to stop using the Uber app.

"They love seeing the little cars," he stated. "They think it's like a computer game. They don't care if their drivers are unvetted or poorly paid. They don't care if taxi companies with real labor contracts are circling the drain. They get to see those little cars on their iPhones. They're happy as clams."


"People like danger," stated another Tesla spokesperson. "They want to be part of it."



One Person Found That Facebook Hasn't Shared Your Information With

to do about the access to personal information that Facebook's original agreements with phone and device makers gave away, but were glad to find one person who still claims to have no access to your private information.

"These guys are really rich," pointed out the FTC spokesperson. "I mean *really* rich. We don't really *have* rules for these guys."

Facebook affirmed the information sharing but noted that the company was very young at the time and that information had yet to be shared with Flora Brest, who stated for the record that she's never heard of Facebook and that everybody's passwords were safe with her.

At least 60 device-makers received personal user information from millions of Facebook users including Apple, Amazon, BlackBerry, Microsoft, and Samsung. Facebook's Mark Zuckerberg countered

that the deals had enabled people to enjoy playing with "like" and "dislike" buttons.

"They love those things," stated Zuckerberg. "Hitting that little button is the best part of their day."

Critics carped that Facebook had violated compliance with a 2011 FTC consent decree regarding privacy protections, but an FTC spokesperson quickly put a finger to his lips, saying "shhh."

"We're not sure what we can do at this point," added the spokesperson. "Like I said, these guys are really, really rich. *And they have our information, too.*"

Congressional representatives reluctantly agreed that maybe Zuckerberg should have to come back to Congress and answer some more questions, but agreed that somebody better brief them better than last time.

"I don't really know what an algorithm




