## Burrowing Owl Explains Extremely Brief Visit to Cesar Chavez Park



AS ANYONE CAN PLAINLY SEE THERE'S PLENTY OF ROOM FOR BURROWING OWLS at Cesar Chavez Park as long as they're willing to share with the off-leash dogs and dang it, they just shouldn't be so selfish about wanting so much space to themselves.

The one burrowing owl that showed up this fall in Cesar Chavez Park stayed only a few minutes before moving on.

"She was polite," related one park user about the brief encounter, "but she was out of there pretty fast. She said she was waiting for someone but must have gotten the time wrong and flew away."

Burrowing owls mate in the spring, so the traditional fall get-togethers park-goers used to enjoy when there were more of them included pub crawls with snake-calling contests, fashion shows, and the burrowing owl's verion of limbo dancing, flattening themselves against the ground or nearby rocks.

"She asked when the contest was," noted one bird-watcher. "She said she had been the winner one year, and that they used to have singing contests, too."

The birders said they had asked her about the off-leash dog issue, but that the owl just looked away.

The local group Golden Gate Bird Alliance issues statements claiming to support "habitat restoration efforts at important bird habitat sites in the Bay Area" but has refused to address the peculiarity of the fence around the burrowing owl habitat area on the northeast shore being designed to allow dogs of all sizes to pass right through it and treat the owls like dog toys.

"She said their parliament had been forced to conclude that their traditional habitat was not considered important," reflected one park user who had had a chance to talk to her before she flew away. "The permeability of the fence, although aesthetically cunning, was useless in terms of protection.

"She said the artists who created the fence were asked personally to address the matter and didn't care," stated the park user. "The Arts Commission didn't care. So it didn't come as a big shock that the Golden Gate Bird Alliance didn't care, either."

## SF's District Attorney Brooke Jenkins Says "Comfortable Streets" Cause Homelessness

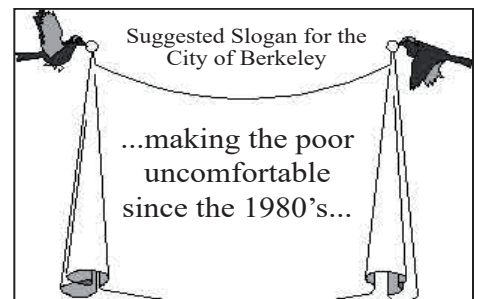

"They might win against us in court," not-

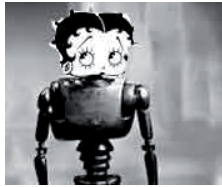

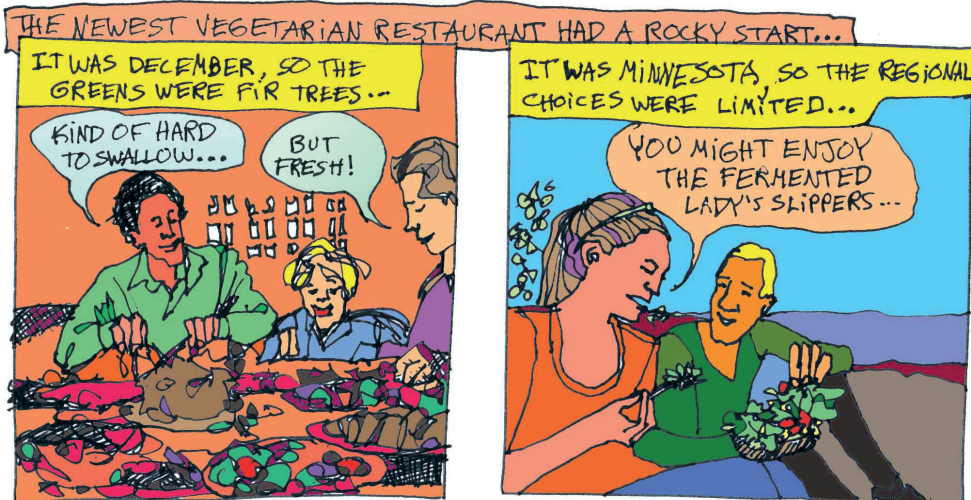

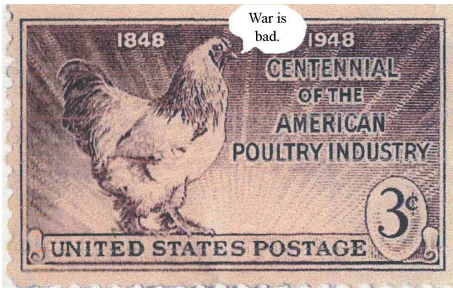




# Military Weapons Momentarily Inconvenienced by Protesters
